

Have you ever heard of OurNotes? OurNotes is a US movement, advocating for enhanced communication and collaboration between clients and clinicians. Through OurNotes, clients can complete a pre-visit questionnaire, allowing them to comment on their health progress, their health concerns, and what they would like to discuss in their upcoming clinical visit. Clinicians can then use the pre-visit questionnaire to help structure and inform the clinical consult.
