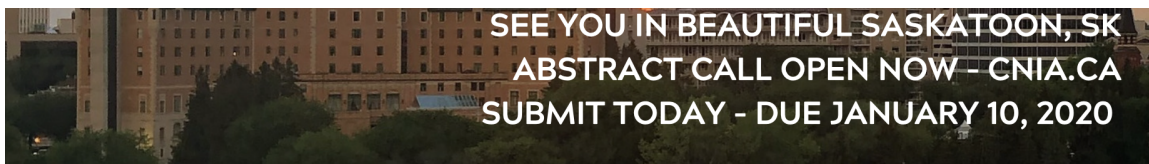
February full of action!

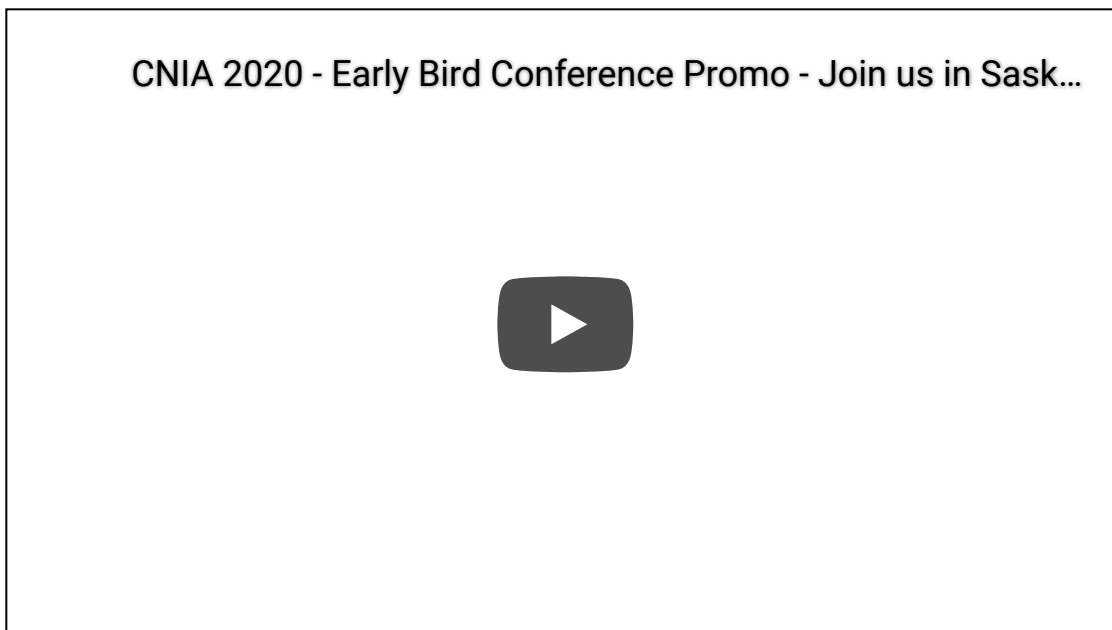


The conference theme is **Nightingale 2.00: Nursing's Digital Future.**

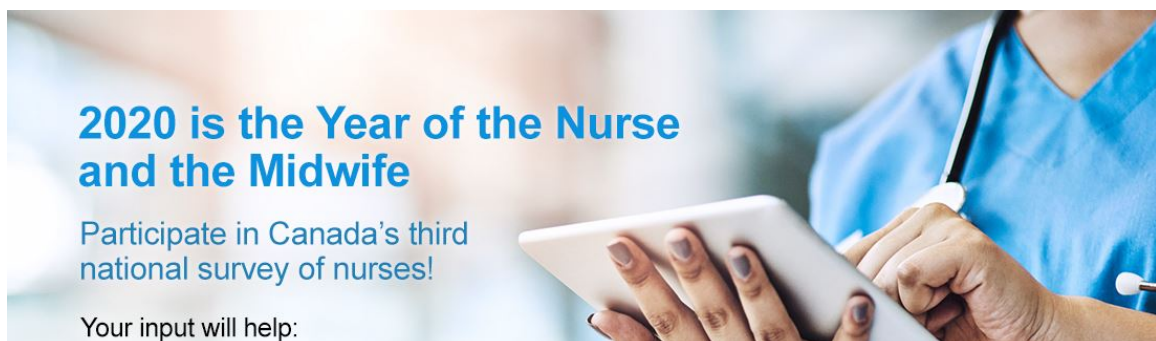
